**Sub** Approval of the Review of Mining Plan along with Progressive Mine Closure Plan (PMCP) in respect of Patabeda Iron and Manganese Ore Mine over an area of 19.425 ha. of M/s M G Mohanty situated in Village- Patabeda, Tehsil- Koida, District-Sundargarh of Odisha State.

Sir,

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (b) of sub-section (2) of section 5 of the Mines & Minerals (Development & Regulation) Act, 1957 and Rule 16, clause (2) of Rule 17 of the Minerals (Other than Atomic and Hydro Carbons Energy Minerals) Concession Rules, 2016 read with Government of India Order No. S.O. 1857(E) dated 18th May, 2016; I hereby **Approve** the Review of Mining Plan along with Progressive Mine Closure Plan (PMCP) in respect of Patabeda Iron and Manganese Ore Mine over an area of 19.425 ha. of M/s M G Mohanty situated in Village- Patabeda, Tehsil- Koida, District-Sundargarh of Odisha State. This approval is subject to the following conditions:-

- (1). The Review of Mining Plan is approved without prejudice to any other law applicable to the mine area from time to time whether made by the Central Government, State Government or any other authority and without prejudice to any order or direction from any court of competent jurisdiction.
- (2). That this approval of aforesaid Review of Mining Plan does not in any way imply the approval of the Government in terms of any other provision of Mines & Minerals (Development & Regulation) Act, 1957, or the Mineral Concession Rules, 2016 and any other laws including Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980, Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 or the rules made there under and other relevant statutes, order and guidelines as may be applicable to the lease area from time to time.
- (3). The provisions of the Mines Act, 1952 and Rules and Regulations made thereunder including submission of notices of opening, appointment of manager and other statutory officials as required by the Mines Act, 1952 shall be complied with.
- (4).The execution of Review of Mining Plan shall be subjected to vacations of prohibitory orders / notices, if any.
- (5). If anything is found to be concealed as required by the Mines Act in the contents of the mining plan and the proposal for rectification has not been made, the approval shall be deemed to have been withdrawn with immediate effect.
- (6). This approval for proposed mining operations and associated activities is restricted to the mining lease area only from this date. The mining lease area is as shown on the statutory plans by the Lessee/QP/Applicant and Indian Bureau of Mines has not undertaken any survey verification of mining lease boundary on the ground.
- (7). Your attention is invited to the Supreme Court interim order in W.P. (C) No. 202 dated 12.12.1996 for compliance. The approval of above said Mining Plan is therefore, issued without prejudice to and is subject to the said directions of the Supreme Court as applicable.
- (8) Lease boundary pillars authenticated by the State Government shall be maintained around the mining lease at all times in accordance with the rule 12(1)(v) of Minerals (Other Than Atomic and Hydro Carbons Energy Minerals) Concession Rules, 2016.
- (9).This department does not undertake any responsibility regarding correctness of the boundaries of the lease area shown on the ground.
- (10).At any stage, if it is observed that the information furnished in the document are incorrect or misrepresent facts, the approval of the document shall be revoked with immediate effect.
- (11). If this approval conflicts with any other law or court order/ Direction under any statute, it shall be revoked immediately.

- (12). It shall be mandatory for the project proponent, abstracting ground water, to obtain "No Objection Certificate" from Central Ground Water Authority or, the concerned State/Union Territory Ground Water Authority, as the case may be.
- (13). Lessee shall ensure grassing/re-grassing of worked out mining lease area in accordance with Hon'ble Supreme Court Order dated 08/01/2020.
- (14). This approval has been given for mining proposal for the year 2026-27 to 2030-31 and are subject to the validity of lease period.
- (15). The next Review of Mining Plan for the subsequent period of five years shall become due 180 days before expiry of this document proposal period.
- (16). The validity period of the financial assurance shall be renewed before the expiry of the same and should be submitted to this office on or before 01.04.2031.
- (17). The feasibility report considered for reserve/resource estimation as per UNFC is submitted by the preferred bidder / lessee which is prepared based on the current data as reported and it may not establishes the future economic viability of mining project, which may be affected by the market dynamics and other related factors.
- (18). Disposal of OB/Waste as minor mineral shall be carried out only after obtaining permission under Rule 12(1)(k) of Minerals (Other than Atomic and Hydro Carbons Energy Minerals) Concession Rules, 2016.
- (19). All necessary statutory clearances for implementing the proposed bench parameters shall be obtained from the Competent Authority, pursuant to the enclosed scientific study on slope stability for mine benches and dumps.
- (20). Chemical analysis shall be conducted comprehensively for all radicals, including associated minerals, trace elements, and minor metals, through NABL accredited laboratories as per the Minerals (Evidence of Mineral Contents) Rules, 2015. Further, if any processing or beneficiation of ROM or mineral reject is proposed, complete chemical analysis of the resulting tailings shall also be undertaken and the report thereon shall be submitted within three months to this office.
